RE: Montana Political Landscape – 2024 Primary Election

Note: At the time this memo was written, only about 93% of precincts are fully reported, but we do not expect it to materially impact any outcomes. The percentages related to turnout and vote totals may be slightly off.

The Montana Primary Election was held on June 4. Voter turnout was low at just over 40%. Primary elections are usually low voter turnout. For example, last cycle's primary had only 39.40% turnout. 2020 was the last cycle where there was a presidential race and all statewide races were up for election and there was 54.87% turnout. Below are the outcomes of the primary election and the matchups for the general election. I've also attached a spreadsheet showing all of the legislative races.

U.S. Senate

The Montana Senate race continues to be one of the most hotly contested Senate races nationwide this cycle as it will be one of a handful of races that determine party control of the U.S. Senate. Incumbent Jon Tester (D) won the primary with 97% of the vote. Tester will be facing off in the general election against Bozeman businessman Tim Sheehy (R). Sheehy defeated Brad Johnson and Charles Walkingchild in the Republican primary by garnering 74% of the vote. Michael Downey won the Green Party primary with 62% of the vote, over Robert Bard. Sid Daoud, a Libertarian, rounds out the candidates for the Senate race.

U.S. Congress

This will be the first election cycle with Montana's new congressional seat following the 2020 Census. The districts are split essentially between east and west.

Congressional Seat 1. Incumbent Ryan Zinke (R) defeated Mary Todd (R) in a primary challenge 74% to 26%. Monica Tranel is the lone Democrat seeking this seat. Dennis Hayes was the successful candidate in the Libertarian primary with 65% of the vote over Ernie Noble. Zinke and Tranel will face off for a rematch of 2022 in the general election.

Congressional Seat 2. This new seat had the largest fields of both the Republicans and Democrats seeking election with nine Republican candidates and four Democrat candidates. Current State Auditor Troy Downing won 36% of the vote to defeat the other 8 candidates in his primary, including former state representative Joel Krautter, current Superintendent of Public Instruction Elsie Arntzen, current State Senator Ken Bogner, former Montana Congressman Denny Rehberg, former state senator Ed Walker, and political newcomers Kyle Austin, Stacy Zinn, and Ric Holden. The amount that Downing won by in this diverse primary is probably one

of the biggest surprises of the primary as most people expected the race to be won by someone in the mid-20s. The Democrat primary was won by John Driscoll with 34% of the vote. He outlasted political advocate Kevin Hamm, father of the named child in the recent environmental *Held* Decision Steve Held, and Ming Cabrera. Troy Downing (R) and John Driscoll (D) will face off in the general election.

Montana Statewide Offices

All five Montana statewide offices are up for election this cycle. These five offices make up the Land Board seats, and each is a term of four years. The Montana Supreme Court races are elected statewide and are nonpartisan races.

Governor & Lieutenant Governor. Incumbent Republican Governor Greg Gianforte (Lieutenant Governor Kristin Juras) easily won the primary with 75% of the vote over challengers Tanner Smith (Governor) and current PSC member Randy Pinocci (Lt. Governor). In the Democrat primary, candidates Ryan Busse (Governor) and Raph Graybill (Lt. Governor) outlasted Jim Hunt and Jerry Driscoll. Libertarian Kaiser Leib is seeking the position of Governor with a currently unknown Lt. Governor partner.

Secretary of State. Republican incumbent Christi Jacobsen is seeking re-election against Democrat Jesse James Mullen and Libertarian John Lamb. This is one of the few races that lacked primary elections.

Attorney General. Incumbent Republican Austin Knudsen defeated challenger Logan Olson with 82% of the vote. Democrat Ben Alke did not have a primary and will face Knudsen in the general election.

State Auditor. While four Republicans initially filed for this seat, the primary only had 2 candidates as the others withdrew or were removed for failure to file paperwork. James Brown defeated John Jay Willoughby 70%-30% in the primary. John Repke (D) will face off against Brown (R) in the general.

Office of Public Instruction. Republican Susie Hedalen defeated Sharyl Allen 62%-38% in the Republican primary. Current state senator Shannon O'Brien (D) will face off against Hedalen in the general.

Chief Justice of the Supreme Court. Current Chief Justice Mike McGrath is retiring, leaving his seat open. The candidates for this position and vote percentage garnered include Cory Swanson (46%), Doug Marshall (16%) and Jeremiah Lynch (37%). Swanson and Lynch will move forward to the general election as they are the two highest vote-getters.

Supreme Court 3. There were also three candidates for the Supreme Court Justice #3 position: Dan Wilson (35%), Katherine Bidegaray (48%) and Jerry O'Neil (17%). Bidegaray and Wilson will advance to the general election.

Clerk of the Supreme Court. The Clerk position is a partisan position, unlike the offices of Justice. Incumbent Bowen Greenwood defeated Jason Ellsworth in the Republican Primary. Erin Farris-Olsen defeated Jordan Ophus in the Democrat primary. Long time Libertarian candidate Roger Roots is also seeking the office.

Montana State Districts

Public Service Commission 2. Incumbent Tony O'Donnell is term limited. Republican Brad Molnar defeated Kirk Bushman in the primary while Democrat Susan Bilo did not have a primary challenger. Molnar and Bilo will face off in the General.

Public Service Commission 3. Three Republicans are sought this seat: Rob Elwood, Suzzann Nordwick and term limited state senator Jeff Welborn. Jeff Welborn narrowly won the race with 40% of the vote. Welborn will face off against Democrat Leonard Williams in the general.

Public Service Commission 4. Incumbent Republican Jennifer Fielder's challenger was removed/withdrew and she is now unopposed for this seat.

Montana Legislature. There are 34 Republican Primaries in the House and 10 Republican Primaries in the Senate, while there are 11 Democrat Primaries in the House and 4 in the Senate.
